SATURDAY JULY 15

Upon arrival at Beijing International Airport, you will be met at the gate by airport **VIP staff**, holding a sign with your name, who will lead you through immigration, baggage claim and customs. Your **China Host** will then meet you after you have claimed your luggage and passed through customs. The China Host will accompany you during the remainder of your stay in China (our China Host acts as a personal concierge to you throughout your stay in China, allowing you to make changes as you see fit...this may mean adding a site or taking out a site, changing a restaurant or booking a foot massage!)

Upon transferred to the hotel, the remainder of the evening will be at leisure (no other services included this evening). (Peninsula Hotel – Connecting Grand Deluxe Rooms)

During the late '60s while the western world busied itself with Beatle mania, more than a million teenagers crammed into the world's largest public square thrusting high their Little Red Books and screaming eternal allegiance to the one, the only, Chairman Mao. Forty years later, the Marxist emperor gazes serenely over **Tiananmen Square**.

You will pass under Mao Zedong's iconic portrait and enter the centuries-old geomantic epicenter of the imperial power he came to replace. Home to 24 emperors, their courts and harems from 1420 to 1924, the **Forbidden City** today attracts millions of tourists from China and around the world. We arrange for special access to Chonghuagong, a section of the Forbidden City that is normally closed to the general public. This is where Emperor Qianlong lived as a child.

This afternoon the children can get their hands dirty whilst taking a private **painting session with a leading local artist**. The Peninsula's Art Residency program has been specifically designed to nurture emerging artistic talent and give them a chance to work and live in the heart of Beijing, the epicentre of China's contemporary arts scene.

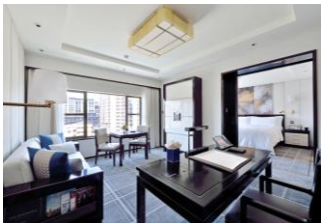

**DAY 3**  
MONDAY/JULY 17 B / L

Today, you will visit the **Great Wall of China**. Built to protect China from the incursions of predatory nomads, the utility and meaning of this fortification has been contested for centuries. The unprecedented scale and unexpected charm of the Great Wall may inspire you. The section that we most highly recommend is the further away, about 2.5 hours drive, but is generally considered one of the most beautiful sections of the Great Wall.

To deepen your experience, **you will be accompanied by a conservationist who has devoted his life to the study and protection of the Great Wall**. After travelling alone and on foot the route of the Ming Great Wall in 1987 and recounting his journey in a successful book, he remained in China and became concerned about the physical and spiritual destruction of the Great Wall.

We arrange for a private banquet on the Great Wall itself (weather permitting) together with an extraordinary kungfu performance of the **famous Shaolin warriors**. After lunch you will be given some time for a stroll along this most magnificent of sites.

**DAY 4**  
TUESDAY/JULY 18 B / L

The **Temple of Heaven** was once the center of a square world where the leader of a Confucian superpower performed sacred sacrificial rites to a circular heaven. The “noblest example of religious architecture in the whole of China” was the place where the emperor came to mediate in the affairs of God and man. Today the 10 acres of ancient trees surrounding the marble terrace altar serve as a public park, free for pensioners and popular with amateur Peking Opera performers.

At the Temple, you will have the chance to interact with locals and you may want to **try your hand at a few popular Chinese games** such as ‘jianzi’ also known as hackysack or Tai Chi Softball.

Beijing’s historic center was designed in a grid pattern of alleyways or *hutong*. After the Communist revolution, the character of this formerly exclusive enclave radically changed as the masses moved in, often building rickety tin-roofed shacks in the courtyards of palatial homes. This huddled arrangement gave rise to the oft-romanticized communal street-life that formed the upbringing of many current generations of Beijingers.

We travel through the narrow lanes on traditional **pedicabs**.

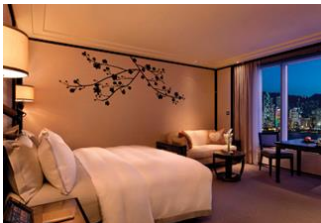

To paraphrase President Coolidge the business of Hong Kong is business. Our full-day tour gives a human face to the history of this fascinating city. Hong Kong's fast-paced development is explored in our detailed **walking architectural tour of Central** from colonial edifices near the waterfront to the totemic skyscrapers of modern times, finishing on Hollywood Road where contemporary art galleries vie for space with antique dealers.

Having ascended to the Mid-Levels on the world's longest escalator, you will hop onto the funicular Peak Tram climbing to **Victoria Peak** where you will lunch enjoying expansive views over the financial hub and harbor.

The **pink dolphin**, colored a vibrant bubble-gum pink, lives in the waters adjacent to the Pearl River estuary in Hong Kong. As a result of Hong Kong's economic rise, the numbers of pink dolphin have proportionately fallen such that viewing the pink dolphins has become part and parcel of increasing their profile and helping preserve them in Hong Kong's waters. We take you out on a **privately chartered boat**, together with an accompanying guide who will point out the pink bobbing heads.
